Government Meetings and Representations



Meeting with MoHUA Officials to discuss RERA Reforms and Ease of Doing Business

A delegation led by President, Mr Shekhar Patel comprising Mr G Ram Reddy, President Elect, Mr Gaurav Gupta, Secretary, Mr Rohit Modi, Vice President, Mr I P Inamdar, Convenor, Legal committee, Mr Nilam Doshi, Convenor, Urban Development committee, Mr Akhil Agarwal, Member, Urban Development committee made comprehensive presentations on the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act (RERA) and key Urban Reforms to the Secretary and Joint Secretary of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA). The discussions focused on enhancing the Ease of Doing Business in the real estate sector.

Key issues highlighted by CREDAI included:

- Streamlining and expediting RERA approvals
- Promoting urban reforms and the digital transformation of government services
- Revisiting the definition of affordable housing to better reflect current market dynamics
- Upskilling of construction workers to meet evolving industry needs

The president also reiterated our recommendations concerning direct taxes and GST, stating that a detailed pre-budget memorandum would be submitted to MoHUA shortly.

CREDAI Committee Meetings

On 26th June, CYW Design Committee organized a call to identify the best architectural projects in India to help shape a potential study tour or design brief. It was decided to gather inputs from members; a Google Form will be circulated requesting their suggestions on exemplary projects across the country.

A virtual training session was held on 19th June 2025 with representatives from State and City Secretariats to review and familiarize participants with the CREDAI National Mobile App. Around 30 participants attended the session and actively shared their feedback. The session covered key existing features of the app, including member onboarding and database management, admin controls for chapters, event management, real-time notifications, reports and newsletters, and gallery uploads. It was agreed that such training sessions will be conducted monthly to ensure regular updates, engagement, and collaboration across chapters. As of 30th June 2025, the app has 7,042 registered members.

CREDAI Urban Development Committee meeting held on 18th June 2025 focused on key reforms and digital initiatives to streamline urban planning. The committee reviewed the outcomes of the first ECG meeting held in Goa, which received strong appreciation from both ECG members and the CREDAI Office Bearers. Two core areas were discussed: the nationwide implementation of the Town Planning (TP) Scheme under the TP Act to enable efficient zoning and minimize delays in land use change approvals, and the development of a unified digital platform to simplify and digitize urban planning processes. The committee also emphasized the importance of flexible use zoning—particularly "urban zones" that permit a mix of residential, commercial, institutional, and healthcare uses—along with FSI incentives to encourage integrated and sustainable development.

The Finance Committee convened on 26th June 2025 for discussion on CREDAI's Union Budget 2026-27 budget recommendations. The committee emphasized refining the recommendations to reflect only relevant and pending issues, ensuring alignment with current regulatory and fiscal frameworks. There was also consensus on updating and consolidating inputs before finalizing the submission or recommendations.

CREDAI 1st Governing Council and General Body Meetings for FY 2025-26



CREDAI successfully convened its 1st Governing Council and General Body Meetings for FY 2025-26 in Goa, bringing together CREDAI leadership and members across India to review progress and chart the roadmap for the upcoming year.

The Governing Council Meeting, convened on 13th June 2025 focused updates across national committees, including constitutional advisory, legal affairs, skilling, environment, urban development, finance, PR & media, aviation, research analytics, emerging cities, expansion & strengthening, CREDAI App development and youth engagement.

The General Body Meeting held on 14th June 2025 broadened the dialogue, featuring a presentation by Adani Cements and highlighting the partnership between CREDAI and the Raah Foundation. The agenda also covered comprehensive updates on legal developments, environmental clearances, RERA, affordable housing, and CSR activities. An open house session with EC members, as well as State and City Presidents, facilitated valuable grassroots-level input. The strong engagement throughout the meeting reflected CREDAI's commitment to a collaborative and inclusive national vision.

These meetings underscored CREDAI's commitment to inclusive policy advocacy, organizational strengthening, and sectoral reforms for sustained growth in the real estate ecosystem.

Skill Initiative



PMKVY 4.0 program is progressing, with approval expected in July and a planned commencement from August 1st. Issues with the MSDS portal are being actively resolved ahead of the start.

Under CREDAI CSR Skilling, training is commencing immediately in Ahmedabad, Pune, Mumbai, and Nashik, and by the second week of July, it will begin in Hyderabad, Bangalore, and Vizag. Subsequently, training in another eight cities is planned for August.

For the Engineers Upskilling Program, online training modalities have been finalised, marketing will begin from July 1st, and the first batch is scheduled to start in the third week of July.

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Accelerating Real Estate Reforms in Uttar Pradesh: Key Takeaways from the Chief Secretary's Review Meeting

In a significant move to resolve long-pending real estate issues, the Chief Secretary of Uttar Pradesh chaired a high-level virtual review meeting on June 6, 2025. The meeting brought together officials from UP RERA, CREDAI NCR (Western U.P. and Ghaziabad), and various development authorities to fast-track delayed residential, commercial, and industrial projects.

Emphasizing the need to increase project registrations and strengthen compliance, the Chief Secretary expressed concern over companies facing liquidation, while UP RERA highlighted a decline in consumer complaints due to continuous awareness campaigns and penal actions. In a welcome relief for developers, UP RERA announced that sensitive bank account details will no longer need to be published in advertisements.

The Chief Secretary directed development authorities to share all sanctioned maps with UP RERA for better integration and mandated immediate processing of all pending applications and map sanctions to prevent further delays. A proposal for a simplified online registration mechanism for "Agreements to Sell" with a nominal fee of ₹10,000 was also discussed to enhance transparency and ease of doing business.

CREDAI NCR representatives presented practical suggestions such as weekly registration meetings, decentralised Noida-specific RERA registrations, elimination of redundant scrutiny, automatic RERA extensions upon map revalidation, and a realistic initial project validity of 5+3 years. The Chief Secretary acknowledged these inputs, reiterating the government's commitment to creating an enabling environment for real estate growth through balanced reforms and collaborative efforts with stakeholders like CREDAI NCR. This proactive approach signals Uttar Pradesh's readiness to drive sustainable urban development and timely project execution.





CREDAI NCR (Western U.P.) Engages with GNIDA to Resolve the issues of Pending Registry and Farmer Compensation

On June 26, 2025, CREDAI NCR (Western UP) had the opportunity to participate in a pivotal meeting convened by the Greater Noida Industrial Development Authority (GNIDA), chaired by the Hon'ble Additional CEO, Shri Saumya Srivastava ji. The primary agenda of the meeting was to review the status of nonexecuted registries—those for which permissions have already been granted but remain pending due to varied operational or compliance-related reasons.

During the meeting, the Authority highlighted a significant concern: out of the 77 developers who had availed relief under the Hon'ble Amitabh Kant Relief Scheme, nearly 27 developers have yet to fully pay the second installment. The Authority emphasized the importance of timely compliance and has sought CREDAI's support in engaging with its member developers to ensure recovery of the pending dues.

Representing CREDAI NCR (WUP), the Vice-President and Secretary actively participated in the discussions and brought several critical matters to the table. Chief among these was the ongoing stay order related to farmer compensation—a long-standing issue impacting registry execution and project finalization across the region. The CREDAI representatives also requested the Authority to consider granting partial Occupancy Certificates (OCs) and registries on a pro-rata payment basis, which would provide much-needed relief to both developers and homebuyers alike.

Reassuring the delegation, the Hon'ble ACEO informed that the Authority is seized of the matter and is currently examining the stay order on priority. GNIDA is committed to proposing a balanced and mutually beneficial resolution that would address the concerns of all stakeholders while safeguarding public interest.

This engagement is yet another step in CREDAI NCR's ongoing commitment to work collaboratively with government agencies to resolve policy hurdles, improve transparency, and facilitate the timely delivery of homes. The association remains hopeful that the issues discussed will be addressed constructively and expeditiously.

NewTech Committee of CREDAI NCR (Haryana) Advances Vendor Registration System

The meeting of NewTech Committee convened on Tuesday, 17th June 2025, to review and discuss the progress of the vendor registration and feedback system being developed under the guidance of NewTech Committee. The meeting marked an important step toward streamlining vendor data collection and improving user experience across platforms.

Key highlights of the meeting included a walkthrough of the proposed data management process. A Google Sites link showcasing the live data will be created soon.

Access will initially be granted to Tech Committee members, with a group of 2–3 members designated to closely review and verify the collected information. A validation team, comprising five members, will be responsible for final data authentication.

The upcoming application will include a tutorial video to assist users in navigating the platform. Notably, the system will also feature access options for non-members, and each company will nominate one point of contact to manage and update their respective data entries.

West Bengal Pollution Control Board Event


